2016 Elections Your Vote Will Be Critical to Determining Direction Illinois Takes

From the Presidential election to the state legislative contests, Illinois voters face another critical election in November. Governor Rauner’s agenda which seeks to improve Illinois’ economic environment and efforts to return Illinois’ budget back to reality has been blocked by the Democrat super majorities in the General Assembly.

The 71 to 47 Democrat House majority has not been successful in most cases in overriding gubernatorial vetoes. Only one defector from the party caucus is necessary and Rep. Ken Dunkin (D-Chicago), Rep. Scott Drury (D-Highland Park) and Rep. Jack Franks (D-Woodstock) were often, one or more, joined House Republicans in supporting the Governor’s veto. However, two of these lawmakers are not returning to the legislature in 2017...Dunkin was defeated in the primary and Franks is not seeking re-election to the House. House Speaker Michael Madigan (D-Chicago) is seeking to expand his super majority and effectively reduce Governor Rauner to a lame duck his two remaining years in his term that ends at the end of 2018.

In turn, Governor Rauner is assisting House Republican candidates in their campaigns to unseat incumbent Democrats. The task looks extremely difficult in that at least ten Republican-held seats while only eight Democrat-held seats are hotly contested.

The Senate Democrat 39-20 supermajority likely will be cut by one or two members leaving them several votes above the 36-supermajority status.
